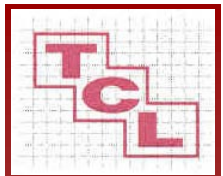

### **SUMMARY OF QUALIFICATIONS**

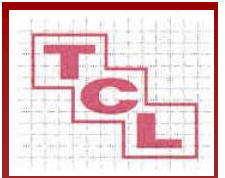

During his time at York he had the opportunity to become involved with practical applications of planning issues. He worked as part of a team to create a master plan for a neighbourhood in Toronto, which involved helping to facilitate a public meeting with local residents and taking their input to the drawing board. He has managed and collaborated in research reports on topics as diverse as parking management at regional transit stations in the Greater Toronto Area, integration of environmental and urban planning in the City of Peterborough, and planning for downtown revitalization in small and mid-sized communities. In his Masters research project David studied downtown revitalization programs in place in Northern Ontario's large urban centres, and discussed the opportunities for the upcoming Growth Plan for Northern Ontario to assist the North's cities achieve their planning goals. David is knowledgeable in areas such as policy development, community improvement planning, urban design, growth management planning, planning for climate change, environmental planning, and transportation planning.

David has work experience with the Ministry of Northern Development, Mines and Forestry as a research assistant on the ongoing development of the Growth Plan for Northern Ontario. Here David researched topics such as regulatory reform, economic development, aboriginal economic development, and forestry policy which have helped to enhance his understanding of policy development processes and research methodologies.
